Another year has flown by and we are once again so grateful for your continued support.

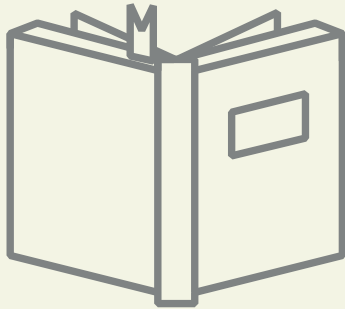

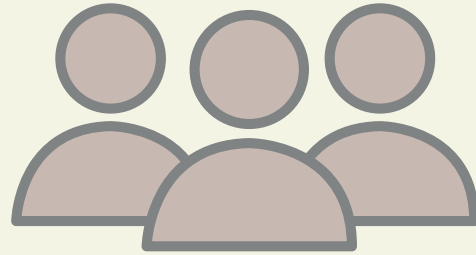

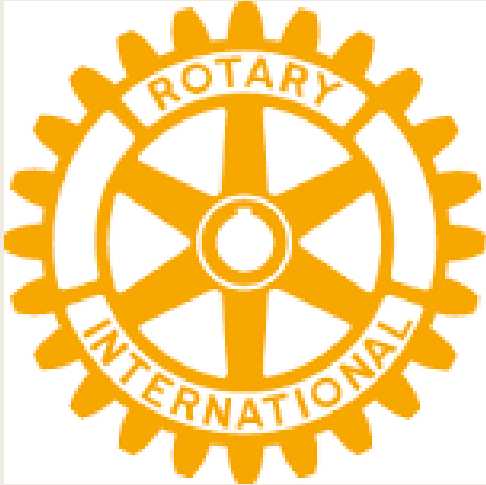

Her story



Growing up, Sunita did not have an easy life. At the age of five, she was a bonded worker for four years, forced to live away from her family and work relentlessly for no pay. Though being a child herself, she worked a servant in the household, cooking and cleaning from 4am until 11pm. Her parents were both labour workers and had little money to provide for the family.

When Sunita returned home from being bonded, her family was unable to pay for her to get an education. However, her mother soon joined the local mothers group and was recognized by Creating Possibilities (CP), Her International's on-the-ground, Nepali partner organization, as someone who could use financial support for schooling. Her International, with CP, supported Sunita so that she could continue her studies.

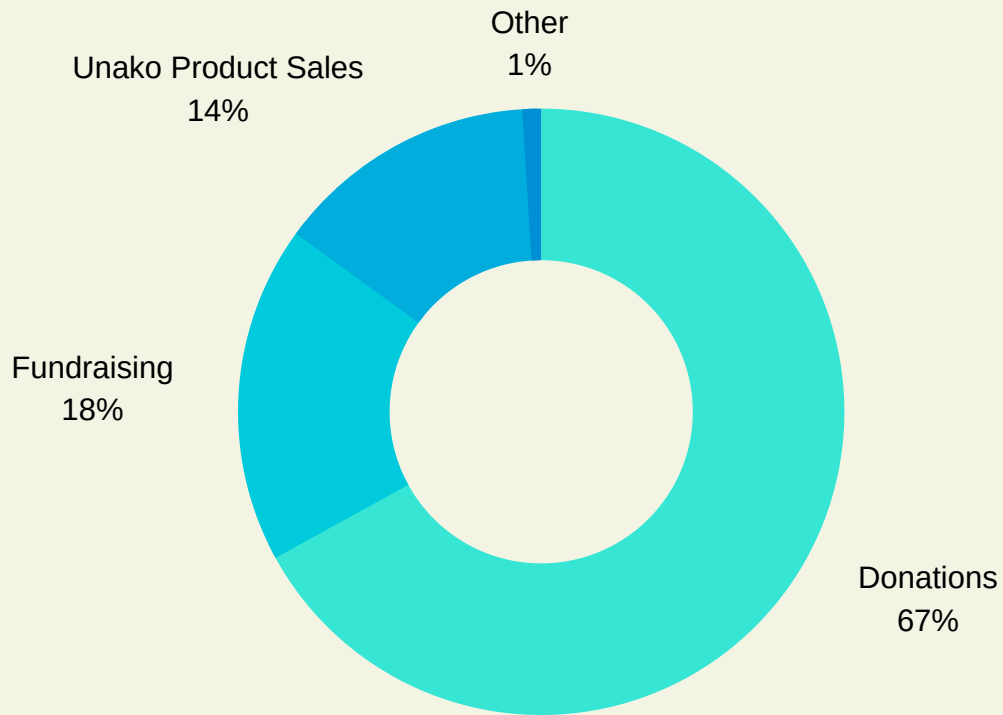
Sunita was an excellent student with a strong motivation to learn. Once she reached Grade 10 she announced that she would like to be a nurse. Sunita enrolled in nursing school where she faced many challenges in her first year; high expectations, difficult course load, bullying by the older students, as well as an injury. She ended up leaving the course for 6 months to return home to recuperate.

When Sunita recovered, she returned to school and had to work incredibly hard to catch up to the other students. Even with the set back of an injury, Sunita successfully completed her studies within three years.

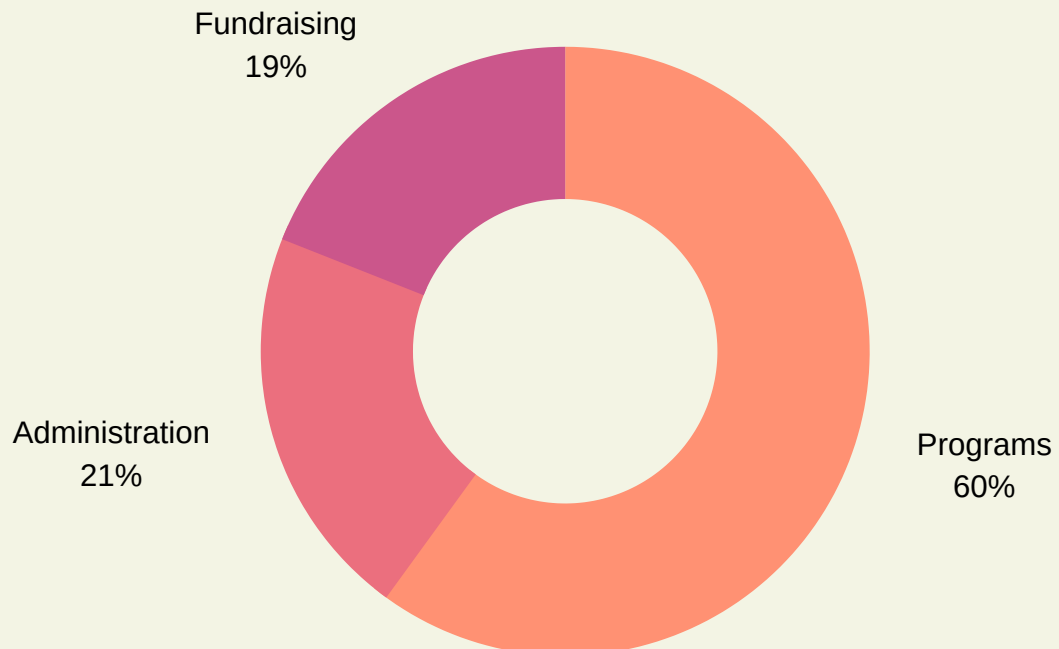
Now a fully registered nurse, Sunita returned to her community in Dang, Nepal to give back to the community that helped her follow her dreams. She visits Mothers' Groups to offer health sessions, works with local health posts, and volunteers at the Unako Community Centre.
